Government investment in prevention efforts through mentoring and education, as well as gender-informed system reform, could save countless girls' lives.

Mentors promote confidence, enable dreams, and encourage growth. They are an invaluable part of our community and we need to ensure all youth in America have access to the right support to succeed.

The benefits of mentoring are well-documented and can include better grades, improved relationships with family and peers, and higher engagement in one's community. All youth can benefit from positive relationships with adults who encourage their potential and open their eyes to new possibilities for their futures. These experiences are even more critical for children and teens who come from difficult socio-economic backgrounds or face other challenging circumstances. At-risk adults who had a mentor are 35 percent more likely to aspire to graduate college than those without mentors.
